SUBJECT: Cultural Observances and Awareness Events Policy

- 1. Special observances are events and activities held annually in support of Joint Congressional Resolutions, Presidential Proclamations, to celebrate the achievements of all the groups that comprise American society. Since 1968, the Department of Defense has proudly supported observances through the development of local recognition programs and diverse activities.
- 2. The following are the eight observances that are observed by the Alaska National Guard:
 - a. Martin Luther King Jr. Birthday Third Monday in January
 - b. National African American/Black History Month February
 - c. Women's History Month March
 - d. Holocaust Remembrance Day/Days of Remembrance April/May
 - e. Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month May
 - f. LGBT Pride Month June
 - g. Women's Equality Day 26 August
 - h. National Hispanic Heritage Month September/October
 - i. National American Indian Heritage Month-November
